

Carex pensylvanica

Pennsylvania Sedge

This is a low sedge with soft, delicate, arching, semi-evergreen leaves, 1/8" wide. It typically grows in a clump to 8" tall. It is semi-evergreen in moderately cold winter climates. Narrow, grass-like, medium green leaves, 8-12" long, are typically shorter than the flowering stems. Native to thickets and dry woodlands of Eastern and Central North America, it is easily grown in average, dry to medium, well-drained soils in part shade to full shade. Prefers loose loam in dry soils in sun-dappled part shade. Plants spread by rhizomes and by seed in optimum sites.
